If your child was born between 2nd July 2016 and 1st July 2017 they will be due to start St. Caireall's primary school in September 2021. As they are of compulsory school age you must apply for a place in our primary school.

The Citizen Portal for online applications opens at 12.00 noon on 7 January 2021 and closes at 12.00 noon on 29 January 2021 for September 2021 admissions.

- Birth certificates can be uploaded or can be left into the school office before 5th February 2021.
- The Admissions Helpdesk 028 9598 5595 will be available for digital assistance
- If you do not apply before the closing date/time of 12.00 noon on Friday 29
 January 2021, your application will be treated as a late application.
- If you are unable to apply online, paper applications will only be available on request from the Education Authority.
